Statewide waiver in partnership with federal government to expand Substance Use Disorder Services 2015-2021

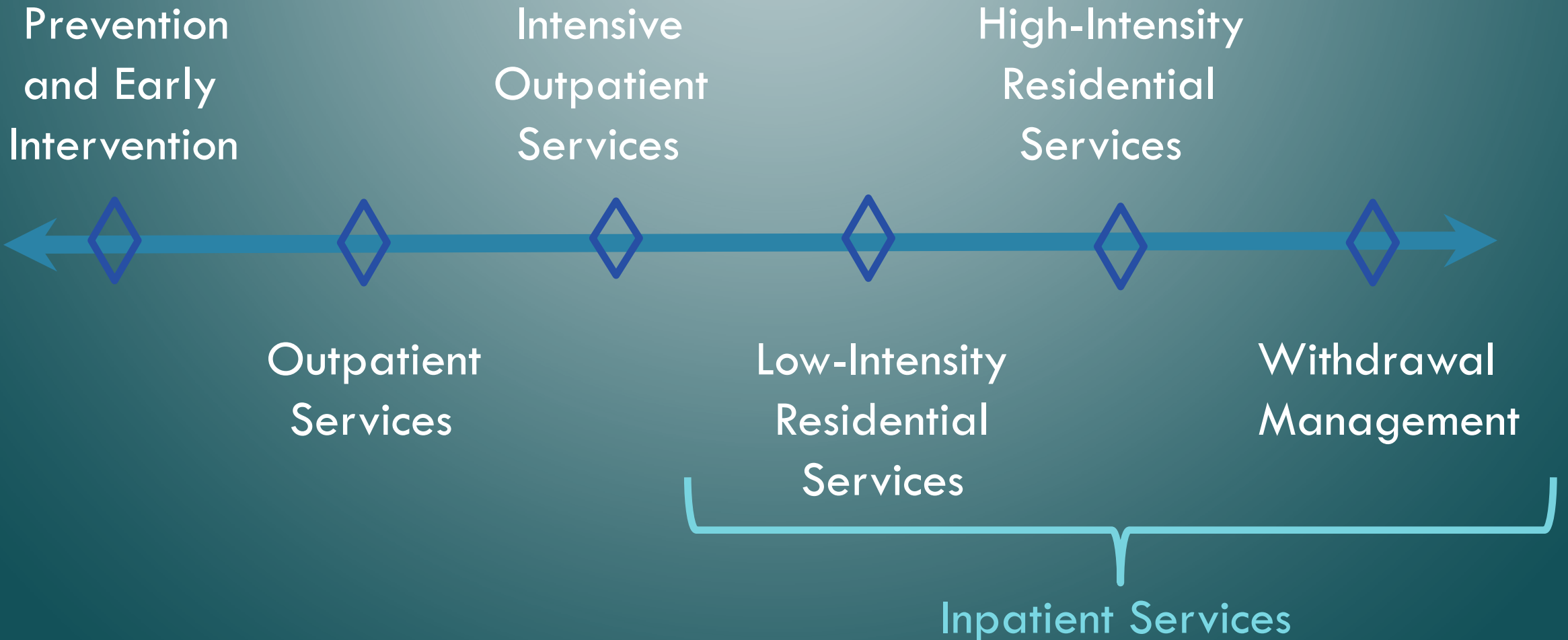
